How to make: Liquid Manure

Liquid Manure is a food for plants made from animal droppings

Animal droppings
contain food for plants.

But putting droppings
directly on plants
burns them!

Liquid manure feeds
plants safely.

Liquid manure

- is a free fertilizer
- is easy to make
- increases yields



Apply 1 tampeco of diluted liquid manure to each plant every 2 weeks in the growing season

- Materials**
- Fresh animal droppings eg cow, chicken, goat, pig or rabbit droppings
 - Container, eg a jerrycan, drum, bucket, or pot
 - Nylon or sisal sack, eg a charcoal sack
 - String
 - Stick
 - Water

Apply to vegetables like cabbage, tomatoes and maize

Step by Step

① 

Fill with droppings
Half-fill the sack with some manure. Put a stone on top to weigh it down.

② 

Tie to stick
Tie the top of the sack up with string. Then tie it to the stick.

③ 


Put in water
Place the sack into the container. Fill the container with water.

④ 

Cover
Cover and put under a shade to prevent the manure escaping into the air

⑤ 

Stir daily
Every day remove the cover and shake the sack.

⑥ 

Dilute
Add 2 tampecos of water to 1 tampeco of liquid manure, and apply to crops
